

## First results of the project

As a result of the second phase of the project, an occupational standards identification for sharing economy practitioners and a comprehensive skills and knowledge profile analysis has been produced within the framework of the project. The main conclusion of the mismatch has been:

The participants in the survey essentially through their answers stated that they need assistance or they lack when called to communicate in a foreign language, digital competences, sense of initiative and entrepreneurship, mathematical competences and social and civic competences. On the other hand, organizational skills, lifelong learning and general communication skills are developed in an adequate percent.
